### **BID SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE PAINTING OF TRAFFIC CONTROL LINES, CROSSWALKS, STOP BARS, ARROWS, ETC. WITHIN THE CITY OF BROOKLYN, OHIO**

The City of Brooklyn will be accepting bids for the Striping of its City streets until 11:00 A.M., August 9, 2018 at Brooklyn City Hall, 7619 Memphis Ave., Brooklyn, OH 44144. Sealed bids must be hand delivered or delivered by mail to John Verba, Director of Public Service, by the date and time listed above. Any bids received after this date and time will be returned unopened. The bid must be submitted on and with the forms, etc., in a sealed envelope.

All questions or requests for additional information must be submitted by 12 noon, Thursday, August 2, 2018 to John Verba, Director of Public Service, City of Brooklyn, 7619 Memphis Avenue, Brooklyn, OH 44144. Email questions or inquires shall be submitted to John Verba at [jverba@brooklynohio.gov](mailto:jverba@brooklynohio.gov). All questions and answers will be sent to all contractors.

Each bid shall state the full name of every person or company interested in the same and shall be accompanied by a bond in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the total amount of the bid, or a certified check in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the bid. Checks or bid bonds of unsuccessful bidders will be returned after a Contract has been awarded and entered into or upon the rejection of all bids.

The City of Brooklyn reserves the right to reject any or all bids or accept what is, in its judgment, the bid which is in the city's best interest. The city further reserves the right, in the best interests of the city, to waive any technical defects or irregularities in any and all bids submitted. All bids are governed by the general conditions found in the request.

Bidders will be deemed committed to the Department of Labor's goal and timetables for the Cuyahoga County area, as specified in the Notice of Requirements for Affirmative Action to ensure Equal Employment Opportunity by submitting a properly signed bid. Each bidder must complete and return along with their bids a Non-Collusion Affidavit, Non-liability for Delinquent Taxes, Prevailing Wages Affidavit, and must sign the Equal Opportunity Employment form ensuring that all employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their race, creed, color, sex, or national origin.

The City of Brooklyn is an Equal Opportunity Employer and advises the public that it does not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, color, creed, religion or handicap, in admission or access to, or treatment or employment in, its programs and activities.

Bidders will be required to comply with Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code, pertaining to wages and hours on public roads.
