

Brooklyn Community Improvement Corporation

The Brooklyn Community Improvement Corporation seeks candidates to be considered to serve as Trustees on its Board of Trustees.

The City of Brooklyn desires to convert challenged land into marketable and ready-to-build land for the purposes of creating new and retaining existing jobs and to increase the tax base of the city.

The purpose of a not-for-profit Community Improvement Corporation organized in accordance to Section 1724.10 of the Ohio Revised Code, is to promote the public health and safety of its residents, to conserve and protect property and property values; to promote and encourage proper redevelopment; to secure the most appropriate use of land and to facilitate adequate provisions for public improvements, all in accordance with the municipal comprehensive plan, and to ensure the orderly planned development of parcels and land areas in the Municipality.

Therefore, the Brooklyn Community Improvement Corporation will focus its efforts on industrial, economic, commercial, and civil development in the City of Brooklyn, in accordance with Section 1724.10 of the Ohio Revised Code. The Board of Trustees shall consist of five (5) Trustees. A Trustee shall serve for a three-year term. Not less than three-fifths of the Board of Trustees shall be composed of appointed or elected officers of the City of Brooklyn. Trustees shall not receive any stated salary or other compensation for their services, but by Resolution of the Board of Trustees may be reimbursed for their direct expenses for attendance.

Meetings generally are held quarterly but may be called by the President or two Trustees when needed. Each Trustee shall be entitled to one vote. All activities are undertaken in accordance with the Code of Regulations of the Corporation and in accordance with Section 1724.10 of the Ohio Revised Code.
