





COUNCIL MEETINGS

April 25, 2016

- Confirmed the appointment of John Bundy to the University Hospital Board of Trustees.
- Authorizing an agreement with James G. Zupka, C.P.A., Inc. to provide Audit Services to the City of Brooklyn for the audit periods 2015-2018, pursuant to authorization of the Auditor of State. Rates are \$27,328 for 2015; \$27,840 for 2016, and \$28,800 for 2018.

May 9, 2016

- Confirmed the appointment of Andrea Wittine to the University Hospital Board of Trustees.
- No objections on a liquor permit stock transfer for AMC Theaters and no position taken on a Liquor Permit for Cleveland Hospitality Professional at St. Theodosius.
- Approved the Brooklyn Police Department to apply for a grant from the Department of Justice COPS Hiring Program. The grant would cover \$125,000 of the salary and benefits of one new police officer.
- Approved a change order in the amount of \$215,000 for the 2016 Streets Program. The total cost of the program is \$1,142,200.
- Approved the issuance and sale of \$356,496 Notes, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay costs of resurfacing certain streets to be approved by City Council, together with all work incidental thereto.
- Approved the issuance and sale of \$303,504 Notes, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, to pay costs of improvements to city buildings, including parking therefor.
- Approved Section 1360.32 "Foreclosure Filing Notification" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Brooklyn.

May 23, 2016

- Established a Vacant Property Registration in the Codified Ordinances. This makes it mandatory for the owner to notify the city if the property becomes vacant anytime during the foreclosure process.
- Establishing the position of Part-Time Inspector within the Building Department and repealing the position of Electrical Inspector. This is an update of the ordinances to accurately reflect the duties of the Inspectors used by the City.
- Amended for the compensation for non-bargaining employees. This increases to the ranges of 8 positions so the Mayor has the authority to grant Cost of Living that matches that of the bargaining units based on performance evaluations.
- Authorized Inter-Fund Transfers from the General Fund to Street Lighting (\$35,000); Retrospective Claims (\$225,000); and Bond Retirement (121,750).
- Authorized the purchase of a Zamboni 552 from Frank J. Zamboni & Co. in the amount of \$137,292.10 as part of the National Joint Powers Alliance. This was in the capital budget.
- Approved a contract with International Association of Fire Fighters Local 1145. They received a 2% increase; added a labor management committee; updated the Non-Discrimination clause; and added a step on the wage progression.

June 13, 2016

- Approved the agreement with Cargill to purchase salt at \$56.29 per ton through the Brecksville Purchasing Consortium.
- Approved two change orders for the landfill for a drainage swale and repairs for \$22,925.06.
- Approved the purchase and installation of new carpet for the Senior Center in the amount of \$39,778.60 through State of Ohio Government Pricing. This was included in the capital budget.
- Approved the purchase of 35 Taser weapons and accessories for the Police Department in the amount of \$36,010.19. This was included in the capital budget.
- Repealed Section 1501.06 "Fire Safety Watch" of the Codified Ordinances. Eliminates the need to have a Fire Inspector at an event of 400 or more and combines the Fire requirements needs under Chapter 713.
- Amended Chapter 713 "Public Social Functions" of the Codified Ordinances. This clarifies the burden is on the organizer to plan and pay for safety personnel and leaves to discretion of safety personnel to determine needs.
- Approved the purchase and installation of a Network Upgrade for City of Brooklyn's Computer System from CISCO in the amount of \$61,506.29.
- Approved an Ordinance Permitting Animals in Memorial Park – excluding Sports areas, Pavilion, and Playgrounds. Amended Section 313.11 "Right turns on Red Prohibited" of the Codified Ordinances. This ordinance modifies school hours to read 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. for the following intersections: Ridge Road/West 6th Street; Ridge Road/Biddulph Road; Biddulph Road/Roadoan Road; and Biddulph Road/Southwood. Council may pass this on emergency at the June 27th Council Meeting or have a special council meeting the first two weeks of July.
- Authorizing the purchase of a 7400 SFA 4x2 International 2017 truck from Rush Truck Centers for \$76,077 through State of Ohio Govt. Pricing. This salt truck was approved in the capital budget.
- Authorizing the purchase of a snow and ice removal package for installation on a new 2017 International truck from Glendhill Road Machinery Co. for \$47,713.35 through State of Ohio Govt. Pricing. This purchase includes a "V" box hopper spreader, snow plow hitch, snow plow, central hydraulic system and LED light system.
