ELECT TO RECYCLE CAMPAIGN SIGNS AFTER THE PRIMARY ON MAY 6

Garfield Heights, Ohio -- Cast a vote for the environment! Following the May 6 primary election, the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste Management District will be collecting campaign and election signs for recycling.

We will accept all plastic and cardboard campaign signs plus the metal stands from May 6-9 and May 12-16, 2014. Signs can be dropped off at the District's facility located at 4750 East 131 Street in Garfield Heights from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The Solid Waste District is a non-partisan recycler. We encourage all Cuyahoga County residents, candidates, elected officials and ward clubs to round up and drop-off election signs so we can keep them out of landfills.

Local ward clubs may also be a drop-off location in their community. Cuyahoga County residents should check with their local ward club to see if there is a collection near them. By recycling your campaign signs, you're casting a vote for the environment. When we recycle, everybody wins!

The District will also accept and recycle campaign signs following the general election on November 4.
